Dr. Jennifer Wemigwans, PhD

Associate Professor, Ontario Institute for Studies in Education and President at Invert Media

Jennifer Wemigwans is Anishinaabe (Ojibwe/ Potawotami) from the Wiikwemikoong Unceded Reserve. She is an Assistant Professor at the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education at the University of Toronto, where she teaches in the Adult Education & Community Development Graduate program. Dr. Wemigwans takes pride in working to invert the conventional use of media

by revealing the potential for Indigenous cultural expression and Indigenous knowledge through new technologies, education and the arts. Her book A Digital Bundle: Protecting and Promoting Indigenous Knowledge Online (2018) explores the prospects of education and digital projects in a networked world.

Currently, her work develops new pathways for digital production with a focus on the convergence between Indigenous knowledge, the arts and education. This work supports the articulation of diverse Indigenous knowledge. Prior to joining UT, Wemigwans produced numerous resources in deep consultation with Indigenous knowledge keepers and elders from across Canada, the U.S., and Central and South America. She has earned a reputation for ethically translating Indigenous knowledge in ways that are consented and recognized by Elders and knowledge keepers. Her work in academia and online technologies puts her in a unique position to tap the pulse of innovation in Indigenous education, the arts, and media.



**Dr. Rob Power**Assistant Professor, Education, Cape Breton University

Dr. Rob Power is an instructional design and educational technology innovator who was named winner of the Cape Breton University Instructional Leadership Award for 2021, and who has been nominated for the Atlantic Association of Universities Instructional Leadership Award and the Mt. Royal University Teaching Excellence in Lifelong Learning Award.

Rob's career has spanned over two decades in the K12 and higher education sectors, and he is currently an Assistant Professor with the School of Education and Health at Cape Breton University, and an Adjunct Professor with the Mitch and Leslie Frazer Faculty of Education at Ontario Tech University and the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences at Athabasca University. Rob is also a Past-President of the International Association for Mobile Learning (IAmLearn) and is currently President of the Canadian Network for Innovation in Education (CNIE|RCIE).

Reflecting Indigenous Knowledge online has the potential to transform education across Canada. In this talk, Dr Wemigwans explores how to ethically present Indigenous Knowledge online through the creation of Digital Bundles. FourDirectionsTeachings.com is an example of a Digital Bundle, an online site where Elders' Teachings from five distinct First Nations are presented. Digital Bundles represent a way to transform education by using new technologies to articulate Indigenous Teachings and introduce Canadians to Indigenous epistemologies.

### **Collaboration and Co-Creation to Transform Access to Learning**

In this presentation, Canadian Network for Innovation in Education (CNIE) President, Dr. Rob Power, will discuss his recent experiences with the transformation of how educators and learners collaborate on the co-creation of digital learning spaces and resources. 


# // Wayfinding and Accessibility
