

In NL, he was Director of Research and Principal Author of the 1995 Report of the Task Force on Community Economic Development and led the process to establish Regional Economic Development Boards in 20 Economic Zones. He also led the development of a strategy for small-scale manufacturing in NL. Rob holds a Ph.D. in Industrial and Business Studies from the University of Warwick, England.


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


#### **Accessibility**
